Overview:

Victorious Community Development, Inc. seeks a dynamic and experienced Project Director to lead our Community Policing Youth Violence Prevention & Intervention Program. This individual will be responsible for the strategic planning, implementation, and evaluation of initiatives aimed at reducing youth violence through community policing strategies. The Project Director will collaborate with law enforcement, community leaders, and youth organizations to develop and promote programs that address the root causes of youth violence and foster a safe and supportive environment for young people.

Key Responsibilities

Key Responsibilities include:

- Strategic Leadership: Provide visionary leadership for the program, including the development of a strategic plan that aligns with VCD's mission and community needs.
- Program Development: Design and implement evidence-based interventions and activities that engage youth and promote positive policing relationships.
- Community Engagement: Establish and maintain partnerships with local schools, law enforcement agencies, and community organizations to enhance program effectiveness. Coordinate and manage collaborative partnerships among community leaders—including clergy, public and community-based service providers, policymakers, and other key stakeholders—dedicated to reducing violence, while also facilitating meetings and delivering impactful public presentations.
- Advocacy and Policy: Advocate for policies and practices that support youth violence prevention and intervention efforts.
- Grant Management: Oversee grant applications and manage program budgets to ensure fiscal responsibility and sustainability; identify and secure grants.
- **Team Management:** Lead and mentor program staff and volunteers, fostering a culture of excellence and continuous improvement. Develop team schedules and assist in the successful onboarding and training of team members. Create and communicate a clear list of expectations and goals for team members to follow. Keep the team motivated and focused on their daily tasks and project goals. Provide frequent feedback on employee performance, address weaknesses or inefficiencies, and offer support to improve skill gaps. Nurture collaboration amongst team members.
- Evaluation and Reporting: Monitor program outcomes, prepare reports for stakeholders, and adjust strategies as necessary to achieve program goals.
